Hello Riley Families,

Thank you to all of our families for two great months of school! We want to continue to focus on our school SOAR expectations. Each letter in the word SOAR means something.

S means Safety. We want all of our families to feel physically and emotionally safe at school every day. We do not tolerate bullying behavior at Riley!

O means On-time. It is very important for students to attend school every day and to be on-time. Last year, we had about 28% of our students miss more than 20 days of school and research shows that learning is severely impacted in a negative way when students miss more than 10 days of school in a year. Please let us know how we can support students attending and attending on-time.

A means Achiever. We all know that ALL of our students are capable of learning at high levels. Every day, we treat students like they are future career professionals.

R means Respect. Respect is a subjective word and means different things to different people. One definition is "due regard for the feelings, wishes, rights or traditions of others" which is something we can all strive to have. It is an honor to be your Principal.
